Does your argument have a clear structure (intro, body, conclusion)?		
Have you stated your conclusion in your introduction?		
Is everything in your argument relevant to the question?		
Have you given examples and evidence for your reasoning?		
Have you said why/how/because etc. for all your reasons, to avoid ambiguity?		
Have you made use of linking language for:		
 Comparing (similar to) Contrasting (on the one hand, in contrast) Expanding (not only but) Concluding (hence, therefore, to sum up, in conclusion) 		
Grammar and vocabulary		
Have you used at least 3 tenses (including present perfect)?		
Have you used at least one conditional?		
Have you used the passive voice in at least 2 tenses?		
lave you avoided too much repetition of the same grammatical structures?		
lave you tried to use more complex vocabulary?		



Have you spent at least 5 minutes at the end checking your work for the following:
